Who can apply for a Fulbright? If you:

Are a U.S. citizen, *who*

- Will have a bachelor's degree by fall 2013;
- Will not have a doctoral degree as of fall 2013 (you may have a master's degree or be working on either a master's or a Ph.D.); *and who is*
- Thinking of studying, assistant-teaching English, or conducting research abroad...

You could be one of more than 1,700 students who receive a Fulbright U.S. Student grant to go overseas in 2013-14.

The U.S. Student Fulbright Program:

- Operates in more than 135 countries worldwide.
- Offers grants in nearly all fields and disciplines, including the STEM fields, humanities, social sciences, professional fields and creative/performing arts.
