In 2005, the Liberian people took to the polls to vote for a president. It would be the nation's first democratic elections since the bloody coup of 1980. From former child soldiers to village elders, Liberians gathered at voting booths (many for the first time in their lives) to vote for a president. The Liberian people chose Ellen Johnson Sirleaf over soccer superstar George Manneh Weah, making her Africa's first democratically-elected woman President.
