



MUSEUM TEACHER WEEKDAY AND WEEKEND

ANNOUNCEMENT AVAILABILITY

Tudor Place, a historic house museum in Georgetown, is seeking museum teachers to lead interactive school, Scout, family, and adult group programs. Museum teachers teach children, families, and adult groups about life in the nation's capital through interactive tours of Tudor Place and educational hands-on workshops. Programs focus on 18th- through 20th-century life in Washington, D.C.

Completed in 1816 by Martha Custis Peter, granddaughter of Martha Washington, Tudor Place is one of the finest examples of Neoclassical architecture in the country. It was home to six successive generations of the Custis-Peter family, from Revolutionary War times to the 20th century. Training is provided, and onsite parking is available.

Duties may include:

- Prepare classroom space for hands-on workshops, including set up and clean up
- Greet groups
- Lead interactive tours of the historic house museum
- Guide groups in hands-on workshops following the tours
- Assist with preparing and serving teas for Tea and Tour programs

Schedule:

- Programs are scheduled Tuesday–Sunday, within the hours of 10am–5pm
- Programs are scheduled February–December
- Museum teachers are expected to commit to a minimum of 2 programs per month. Additional hours may be available based on scheduling
- Must be available for training session on **Saturday, March 3, 2018, 9am–12pm**

Qualifications:

- Excellent interpersonal and oral communication skills
- Prior teaching, childcare, or museum education experience
- Flexibility and enthusiasm for working with K-8th grade urban and suburban students
- Relevant college degree
- Knowledge of architecture, American history, decorative arts, or horticulture a plus

Salary:

- \$50 per program (each program requires approximately 3 hours of work) and
- \$10/hour for participation in mandatory training sessions)
