

SACRPH 2019: Northern Virginia Call for Volunteers!

Join the Society for American City and Regional Planning History ([SACRPH](https://sacrph.org)) for our 18th National Planning History Conference, held in Northern Virginia, from October 31 - November 3, 2019. Every other year, SACRPH hosts a lively conference of historians, planners, preservations, and urbanists for a series of paper sessions, plenaries, tours, meals, and receptions. A book exhibit, poster sessions, and mobile workshops round out the program. The Conference will interrogate the intersection of ideas and practice in planning history, with topics ranging from the 18th century planned city to Amazon and its influence in the 21st century.
