The San Giuliano Archaeological Research Project (SGARP) is an interdisciplinary excavation and field school exploring long term change in central Italy. The site, named for a medieval church still standing on the central hilltop, consists of a looted Etruscan chamber tomb cemetery (ca. 6th-5th cen. BCE), a medieval hall and tower (ca. 11th-12th century CE), and evidence for a Hellenistic or Roman sanctuary nearby.
